CURRENT MOLESEY ISSUES

MOLESEY HOSPITAL: This is high on the MRA agenda. We won the fight to keep the Hospital in Molesey. Now it is a question of getting full modern hospital facilities either by redevelopment of the present site or on a Molesey site nearby. Our councillors & committee members are tracking progress and continually putting forward ideas on this in support of the Friends of Molesey Hospital.

JOLLY BOATMAN/HAMPTON COURT STATION: Of course we want to keep a fully operational railway station. We are acceptable to a modest housing or office development with adequate parking for the new buildings and for the travelling public. However, we cannot support the present proposals which are grossly over-development of the site. We have worked with and entirely support the objections made by the Hampton Court Rescue Campaign against the buildings mass and lack of adequate car parking.

HEATHROW PLANS: Present Heathrow noise patterns over Molesey are unacceptable. Future noise patterns show no improvement or are even claimed to be less intrusive. We will continue to press Heathrow for flight changes to alleviate aircraft noise over Molesey.

THE RIVER MOLE: The MRA wants the Environmental Agency to agree to keep the River Mole free of the invasive Pennywort weed. They say it won't flood, we say it might and small boats cannot use it and anyway, it looks horrible. We are also pressing the E.A. for a proper maintenance programme for the River Mole sluices.

UNAUTHORISED MOORING: We have continually pressed the Environment Agency and Elmbridge Council to find legal ways to prevent the intrusion of what should be illegal mooring,

FLOODING: We are attending every meeting concerned with the proposed River Thames works. We need real evidence that increasing the water flow from Staines area will not cause flooding in Molesey.

HOUSING: No-one can deny that we need more housing, but not in our public open space or on our recreation areas, either private or public.

PLANNING: Our councillors are concerned about the housing risk to the old Molesey Sewage Farm in the Molesey West ward. It was technically notated as being in Walton South, but we have had it re-notated as a Molesey site which gives us a better level of control.

<u>REMEMBER</u>, Molesey R.A. councillors are your main protectors of our local environment. OUR ACTIVITIES CONTINUE THROUGHOUT THE YEAR - NOT JUST AT ELECTION TIME.

SHOULD FIND PROPER MOORING

ELMBRIDGE RESIDENTS' GROUP (R.A. GROUP)

The Residents'Group at Elmbridge Council, to which the Molesey R.A. belongs, includes Esher, Hersham Village, Hinchley Wood, Thames Ditton & Weston Green, and St. George's Hill, Weybridge. This group has led Elmbridge Council for twenty of the fifty nine years life of the Council, most of this leadership has been in the last thirty years.

PROTECTING THE COMMUNITY - COST OF LIVING

Recently, as we all know, with inflation and fuel costs, living standards are threatened by much increased costs and those on low incomes are particularly vulnerable. The R.A. Group at Council have therefore concentrated on supporting the voluntary social partners to aid the less well - off. Currently this involves £450,000 being allocated to our partners who are charged with looking after those in need.

INVESTING IN A THRIVING FUTURE

The R.A. Group have allocated £1.6m to the programme towards carbon neutral. £1m of this will be to electrify our vehicle fleet with an immediate spend of some £500k of this. This will be in partnership with Surrey CC which have a similar programme.

FUTURE OF OUR HIGH STREETS

This is of great concern to the R.A. Group and the programmes are in hand to make our Shopping Centres attractive and keeping shops open by providing help where we can.

OUR LEISURE SERVICES

The Council owns many of our leisure areas, particularly community sports fields, the commons and of course, the Leisure Centre and Swimming Pools. Where our new financial contracts apply, savings have been found which ensures the future of these facilities. Where there are leisure activities on our main River Thames we are providing drowning rescue equipment, whilst providing free swimming lessons at our pools for 12 - 18 year olds.

COMMUNITY SOCIAL FACILITIES

These principally involve Day Centres and Village Halls. We have modernised our support services and share some of the costs with Surrey CC. on our Day Centres and Meals -on-Wheels. On Village Halls, we have additional support from voluntary Trusts which has lowered the cost to the council and ensured their presence in the community.

YOUR COUNCIL TAX

The R.A. Group have set a below inflation increase for 2023/24 of 2.86%, which on the Elmbridge share of your Council Tax bill, is 14p per week on Band D. This is considered to be ground breakingly low in a period when war and fuel supply difficulties are causing intense inflation.
